

Global Liberal Studies Minor Worksheet

The GLS Minor requires a total of **four** courses (16 credits), some of which could be taken while studying away. Students may double-count up to one course for the minor; or for those who complete the LS Core Program, the Cultural and Social Foundations sequence will satisfy one elective for the minor.

APPROACHES TO GLOBAL STUDIES (4 CREDITS)

Approaches to Global Studies is an introduction to the study of globalization, as well as the interconnections and interdependencies that increasingly characterize contemporary life. This course is recommended as one of the first two classes a student might complete for the minor (APRGS-UF 101).

GLOBAL LIBERAL STUDIES ELECTIVES (8 CREDITS)

Choose two (2) courses from Global Topics, Global Cultures, Advanced Writing Studio, or Senior Seminar. Each curricular area offers courses specific to your interests.

- **Global Topics** places topics of contemporary or historical interest into a global framework (GT-UF 201)
- **Global Cultures** explores the cultural development of a particular region, offering courses such as African Cultures (AFGC-UF 101), Caribbean Cultures (CAGC-UF 101), East Asian Cultures (EAGC-UF 101), Latin American Cultures (LAGC-UF 101), Middle Eastern Cultures (MEGC-UF 101), and South Asian Cultures (SAGC-UF 101).
- **Advanced Writing Studio** approaches writing as a tool for cultural expression and understanding, engaging students in studying examples and producing original works (AWS-UF 201)
- **Senior Seminar** examines world-spanning issues and phenomena through a particular aspect of global connection (SCAI-UF 401) *prerequisite: junior or senior standing, Approaches to Global Studies, and at least one GLS Elective.*

ADDITIONAL ELECTIVE (4 CREDITS)

Choose another Global Liberal Studies Elective from those listed above, or any course taught at a NYU study away site or portal campus that meets the [GLS Advanced Global Topics requirement](#).
