Churchill Scholarship

The [Churchill Scholarship](#) is awarded for advanced study in science, mathematics, or engineering at the University of Cambridge. *NYU Internal Deadline: May 1st*

Marshall Scholarship

[Marshall Scholarships](#) finance study for a degree in the U.K. at participating higher education institutions. Mar-

shall Scholars strengthen the relationship between British and American peoples, with direct engagement in British academics and culture. *NYU Internal Deadline: May 1st*

Mitchell Scholarship

Advice to other Rhodes applicants: I think a lot of people try to be very calculated in their application in an attempt to fit what they think a Rhodes Scholar should look like. The truth is, there is no such thing as a "Rhodes Type" anymore. The other scholars I have met come from vastly different backgrounds, have varying interests, and engage with the world and with others in very different ways. So the best thing you can do is be the best version of yourself in your application.

Favorite thing about attending Oxford: I love Oxford for the same reason I loved New York—there is always so much to do! Between talks, shows, and college events, there is always an overwhelming amount of ways to fill your day. Studying at NYU—and in GLS specifically—I really came to appreciate the opportunities to learn outside the classroom. Though Oxford is evidently a great place for 'formal' learning, it's perhaps more importantly a very special place for informal learning.

Best experience you've had with the Rhodes so far: The best thing about the Rhodes community so far has been the people I've met. You have people coming from all over the world who all passionately study such interesting topics. From experimental psychology to chemical engineering, I've learnt so much more about other fields! It's also been fascinating to see how the other scholars combine their academic interests with other athletic or artistic aspirations. It's lovely to be in an environment that values and celebrates this kind of well-roundedness.
