Select Fellowships for Graduate Study

In the U.K. & Ireland:

Marshall Scholarship

Marshall Scholarships finance study for a degree in the U.K. at participating higher education institutions.

Mitchell Scholarship

The George J. Mitchell Scholarship supports individuals to complete a year-long graduate program or research in any discipline at an institution of higher learning in Ireland or Northern Ireland.

Gates Cambridge

Gates Cambridge Scholarships are awarded to outstanding applicants from countries outside the U.K. to pursue a full-time postgraduate degree in any subject available at the University of Cambridge.

Rhodes Scholarship

The Rhodes Scholarship promotes international

understanding and peace by providing two year graduate study at Oxford University in any field of study under an Oxford College.

In the United States:

Knight-Hennessy Scholarship

The Knight-Hennessy Scholarship is for three years of funding toward graduate education at Stanford University.

In France:

Michel David-Weill Scholarship

The Michel David-Weill Scholarship carries a monetary value of \$80,000 and covers the cost of tuition and living expenses during a two-year master's program at Sciences Po.

Application Development Cohort 2023

The ADC supports NYU's New York City-based applicants to prestigious scholarships and fellowships. Participation in the ADC is required to receive NYU's nomination for the Rhodes, Marshall, and Mitchell Scholarships. It is also encouraged for NYU's applicants to Gates Cambridge, Knight-Hennessy, and Schwarzman. Applications are open to any current junior, senior, or recent alum from all disciplines with at least a 3.7 GPA. Applications to the ADC are due April 3, 2023.

Public Service Summer Institute (PSSI) 2023

The Public Service Summer Institute is a summer-long, cohort-based program designed to support promising students who have demonstrated a commitment to public service. Through guided writing exercises, case studies, and public service networking events, PSSI participants will better understand public service careers and develop materials to apply for relevant Global Awards, such as the Truman, PPIA, Critical Language Scholarship, and Rangel Summer Enrichment Program. Applications to the PSSI are due April 17, 2023 and are open to current **first-years and sophomores** from any discipline with a strong track record of public service. There is no GPA requirement. How did you find out about the Global Equity Fellowship and what inspired you to apply?

During my time at NYU Florence as a freshman, I was inspired by the work of the Global Equity Fellows. They created such a safe, fun and educational space that I knew I wanted to replicate at my next campus. This is how I found out about the position and what encouraged me to apply!

Advice to other applicants (or fellowship applicants in general)?

Share your passions! Don't talk about topics in your interview that you think will sound good, share what you love to do and what you are passionate about. If you love sitting in coffee shops, then suggest holding bi-weekly talks about the IDBE you care about in different cafes.

Tell us about the research you did for involvement in this fellowship?

I researched and made a small guide to six different museums in London, such as the British Museum, to examine their decolonization initiatives within their exhibits. This involved evaluating museum's efforts towards recognizing colonial influences, repatriation initiatives, and visitor education opportunities.

- For Spring 2024 study, and the application deadline is October 5th, 2023.
- Applicants must be US citizens enrolled at a U.S. institution and receiving a Pell Grant at the time of application or term abroad
